

Junior First Aid Course

Who is it for?

The Australian Lifesaving Academy NSW (ALA NSW) Junior First Aid (JFA) course is aimed at students in Years 4, 5 and 6, however content can be customised to suit other primary age students on request. The course has direct links to two key learning areas – Human Society and Its Environment (HSIE) and Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE).

Why is it important?

Research has shown that children as young as 5 years old can learn and effectively perform elements of CPR and basic life support.

What will the students learn?

- What is first aid
- Why we do first aid, including the difference between a big accident and a little accident
- What is danger and how to identify common hazards around the home and school
- How to get help and what to expect when they call 000
- How to check for a response from an injured person
- How to place an unconscious person into recovery position and why it is important
- How to check for breathing and perform CPR

What will the students receive?

- ALA NSW Junior First Aid worksheet
- Fun colouring in worksheets

When and where is the course delivered?
